WHEREAS, the average production cost of SkyWord averaged \$22,772.56 per issue in 2003; and

WHEREAS, the APFA has taken necessary steps to reduce costs; and

WHEREAS, the APFA has continually enhanced the Official APFA Website and frequently updated the APFA HotLine and has become more dependent on the Website and HotLine for dissemination of information; and

WHEREAS, administration of the APFA Website and HotLine and distribution of information using these modes of communication is far less expensive than the production cost of SkyWord each year and much more efficient; and

WHEREAS, there are no current policy requirements on the number of issues per year of SkyWord; and

WHEREAS, the APFA reserves the right to set the publication schedule of SkyWord in the advertising insertion agreement; and

WHEREAS, APFA has the ability to create a smaller, less expensive publication on an "as needed" basis.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that SkyWord be published on a quarterly basis beginning with the first quarter 2004.

BE IT FURTHER RESOVLED, that the new publication schedule remain in place until what time the APFA Board of Directors votes to amend the production schedule.
